Earlier in his career, he taught as a Professor of Nursing at California State University, Long Beach and Dominguez Hills, and held academic and clinical roles with the University of Jordan, King Hussein Cancer Foundation and Center, and Georgetown University.

Throughout his career, Abdel has been a champion for academic-practice partnerships that strengthen healthcare workforce pipelines, increase access to education in underserved communities, and promote health equity. At Unitek, he has led the organization's academic expansion, including new programs and campuses, while maintaining excellence in accreditation and regulatory compliance across multiple governing bodies, including CCNE, ACEN, and CNEA.

Abdel earned his Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Jordan University of Science and Technology, his Master of Science in Nursing from Georgetown University, and his PhD in Nursing Education from the University of San Diego. He completed executive leadership training at the Wharton School of Business and AI in Healthcare training at Harvard Medical School.
